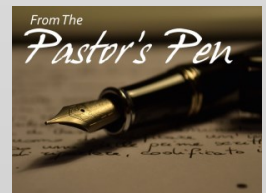

'Transfer the Blessings' (TTB) Sunday - May 7



If you're like most people, you have - either in your mind or on paper - a list of those things you know you need to get done, but that you keep putting off and haven't gotten around to yet. For the majority of Americans, one item on that list is having a legal will in place. No doubt, there are many reasons for this procrastination: no one to educate me, encourage me, help me . . . don't plan to die! As unrealistic as it is, that last 'excuse' is often the main reason why "making a will" remains on many people's above mentioned list.

However, no longer can you say there's nobody to educate, encourage or help me with this urgent and necessary task. That's because we now have at Trinity a committee in place to assist our members with their estate planning needs, including the process of making a will.

The "Transfer the Blessings" ministry began one year ago with the formation of this TTB committee, whose initial task was to revise and implement our church's endowment fund bylaws. These bylaws were approved in October of last year, at which time our endowment fund was established at the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) Foundation in St. Louis with a total of \$76,500. These monies are the result of gifts given some years ago for this purpose by Vern and Lu Neils (gift of stock) and Bernice Schmidt (memorial bequest designated for church worker student scholarships), in addition to some recent gifts. These and future gifts to the endowment fund will provide an ongoing source of income for ministries that would otherwise not be funded by our operational budget. (Up to 5% of total undesignated funds can be distributed to ministry requests each year.) Typically, gifts to an endowment come from an individual or family estate. For that reason, our TTB Committee will continue to provide our members with information, counsel and encouragement in this important area of estate planning. Members of the TTB Committee are: Dennis Miller (Chr.), Mark Helgeson (Treas.), Carol Truenow (Sec.), Dennis Bacon, Joanne Evenson, Joanne Keck, and Lori Zipp.

The next opportunity for you to learn about good stewardship of your estate is on Sunday, May 7th. Mr. David Priebe, retired attorney and planned giving counselor for our MN North District, LCMS, will be here at Trinity that day. In our fellowship hall between services, from 9:15 - 10:15 a.m., he will talk about how a congregational endowment fund works. He will also present information about the preparation of a legal will and how to include planned giving options in a will or living trust as a way of **transferring the blessings** God has entrusted to us for the benefit of future generations. In addition to the creation of a personal legacy, he will share how these estate gifts and bequests can also benefit the giver by offering unique tax savings in the present. Following his presentation, future appointments can be scheduled with David to assist you with your personal estate plan. This is a service that is offered free of charge to our members.

Don't let your attendance in church on May 7th be added to the above mentioned list! Mark it on your calendar NOW . . . and be here THEN!

Pastoral Call Committee Update

The Pastoral Call Committee held an organizational meeting on March 23, 2017. As you all know by now, Pastor Paul will be retiring at the end of September, which will create a Pastor vacancy at Trinity. An informational meeting was held on March 13th, with Pastor Fondow, President of the MN North District, to discuss the procedure and process that is involved in making a "Call." Also assisting our Church will be Circuit Pastor, Pastor Brady Finnern from Messiah Lutheran Church in Sartell.

Jeff Cziok and Jon Lenz will Co-Chair the Call Committee process at Trinity, along with a group of dedicated Trinity members – a complete list of committee members will be listed in the Sunday bulletin on April 2nd. We will be asking the congregation for their assistance, namely to identify goals for Trinity, and Pastoral expectations. The Call Committee will additionally be asking the congregation to "Nominate a Pastor for Consideration," if they wish, and to assist with our "Self-Study." This process will begin on April 2nd, and the congregation will have 3 weeks to complete these items.

Some people singing or hearing "How Deep the Father's Love for Us" may think it's an old hymn. It was written in 1995 by Stuart Townend who, up to that point, had written only contemporary songs. One day, as he was meditating on the cross, Stuart had a feeling he was going to write a hymn--in particular, what it cost the Father to give up His beloved Son to a torturous death on a cross. "What was my part in it? Not only was it my sin that put Him there, but if I'd lived at that time, it would probably have been me in that crowd, shouting with everyone else 'crucify Him'. It just makes His sacrifice all the more personal . . . all the more humbling." This song is being used as a worship resource all over the world to remind us just how deep the Father's love is for all of us . . .

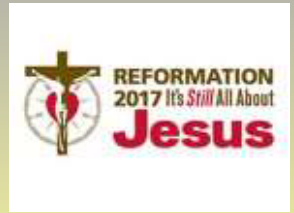
Ha Ha Ha...

PRINCE OF PEACE LEGACY DINNER AND AUCTION

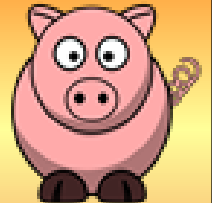

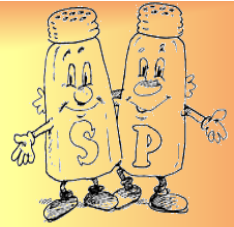

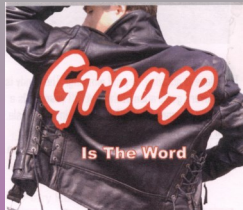
On Wednesday, April 19th there will be trivia night after confirmation classes, at 7:00pm. Join us for all the fun!
