P: Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.

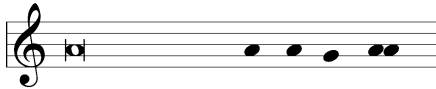


LORD'S PRAYER

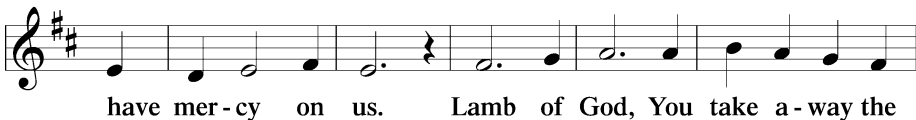

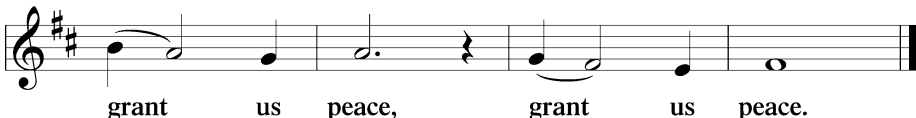

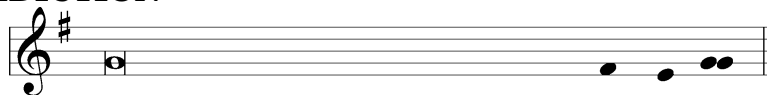
