Today is a Sunday. You are installing a new pastor. would imagine that each of you have your own picture in mind of what that pastor ought to be. You have your own agenda as to what that pastor ought to be or will be. You have your own ideas about the character of that person; will he approachable, loving, kindly, personable? Will he deal well with the

young people of the

congregation? Will he be attentive to the old folks? Will he do evangelism or stewardship? Will he be a worthy organizer, a good preacher? Will he make things go and grow in a God pleasing manner?

We all have our own ideas about what the pastor ought to be and do.

After being in the business for more than 60 years of Church work, I can tell you that you never satisfy everyone's estimation of what you ought to be. And that is not what a pastor is called to do. Even Jesus did not receive kudos from those He served. From some He received a cross. But satisfying the whims of people is not the pastor's task.

In his second epistle to Timothy, Paul writes: Preach the Word; be ready in season and out of season, reprove and exhort, with complete patience and teaching, for the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but have itching ears and will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions.

Preach the Word. That's what a pastor is to do. It is God's Word that is the instrument through which God works to make and keep us as His people. There are other words... Our TV screens inundate us with different messages every day. The message of evolution with its billions of years for this or that is simply stated as fact and repeated over and over and over again until people accept it as fact and believe it. Our country believes in a rule of law and we make laws again and again in the hope of changing the terrible behaviors of people. We so easily forget that behaviors change only when the heart changes, and it is only God who changes hearts for real!

The pastor's task is to bring God's Word to the hearts of his people to help them meet the problems of this world and prepare them for the world to come. He is to do this with patience and

Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree Program

This year we will again participate in the Angel Tree Program which provides Christmas gifts for children that have a parent incarcerated.

For 2.7 million children in the U.S., Christmas may be a time filled with feelings of abandonment, loneliness, and shame that come from having a mom or dad in prison. A gift from that parent, through Angel Tree, can be a source of encouragement for both the children and parent.

"I remember clearly the day I sat on my bunk in the dorm talking with another sister in Christ when the chaplain ladies came in, pushing a cart. I asked what they were doing, and they said they were passing out Angel tree applications. Just filling out an application and choosing some items my children may like brought a sense of motherhood at a disconnected time."

sound teaching. Patience, because we people are slow to really understand. WE have all learned that we are saved by grace alone through faith in the crucified Christ. Yet when asked if they are going to heaven, people respond, "I've gone to church at Trinity all my life." Hard to really "get it". That's why the pastor preaches every Sunday.

We are people wandering in the myths of this world. I heard the TV preacher say in so many words, "Live the Christian life as best you can and everything will turn out all right." We soon learn that just isn't true! Bad things happen to good people. The rain falls on the just and the unjust. As many Christians die of cancer as non-Christians. The devil is active and the whole world bears the taint of evil.

Remember, God did not make the evil. Everything He created was good until man made the change. God had made Adam and Eve and the Garden perfect. They were to have every blessing from God and live to serve and praise Him. But Eve was tempted to be like God, knowing good and evil. Her and her husband's disobedience tainted everything. No longer could mankind offer to God that perfect sinless life. Even if one could be perfect from this moment on, what could that person do with what was past?

But God sent His only begotten Son to live the perfect God-pleasing life according to the father's will. He offered that life to death in payment for the sinful lives of all people fulfilling what we could never do. The Heavenly Father accepted the payment; Jesus was raised from the dead. He offers that payment to us, and even that very Word carried with it the Holy Spirit that we might believe it! Yet our sinful hearts believe that there is something we must do to make our salvation possible.

One common fallacy is that we are the ones who say yes to Jesus. When will we learn that God has done it all? The Spirit works it all. He makes possible everything. We have a wonderful God. He loves so much that though we

were His enemies because of sin, He provided the sacrifice that set us free to be His adopted children. He gave His Son to the agony of the cross to pay with His life, the perfect life, what we could not pay. God accepted His Son's offering and raised Him from the dead for each of us. There is no other religion in this world today that has God saving His people. Usually other gods demand things from people for their salvation. Because we are sinful, we tend to fall back into such kinds of work righteousness. So the preacher is to preach the Word in season and out of season. I would believe this tends to mean whether it is convenient or inconvenient. I would believe that Paul means here to preach whether the message meets with ears that hear or ears that are deaf to the truth of what God wishes to convey.

Our society is one with stopped ears. Church attendance is down. People don't want to listen. They do not want to be told they are sinful, much less be convinced they need a Savior. But the pastor is to preach the Word. We also live in a world where people wish sin away. In some instances bad is counted as good. The political correctness of our times labels same sex marriage or homosexuality as normal and pious behavior. These things exist, and Jesus can forgive such sinners, yet that forgiveness does not mean it is acceptable. It remains against God's will. The pastor is to preach the Word. It is a word that reminds us of our sins and shortcomings, but also shows us God's answer for it in the blood of His Son to forgive all. The answer to our "new found doctrine of political correctness" is to be an evangelist. Preach the Word of truth, endure the hardship of hard hearts and itching ears. Enduring hardship is not an end in itself. The Word is preached to spread the Gospel, to do the work of an evangelist. This is a duty of every Christian, but falls especially upon the pastor.

Through it all I'm reminded of the incident after Jesus entered Jerusalem that final time. There were some Greeks who came up to Philip the Apostle and said to him, "Sir, We wish to see Jesus." David will show you Jesus. AMEN

Music and Worship Notes

Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices, who wondrous things hath done, in whom this world rejoices; who, from our mother's arms, hath blessed us on our way with countless gifts of love, and still is ours today."

An old English preacher once said, "A grateful mind is a great mind," and the Bible agrees. There are 138 Scripture passages on the subject of thanksgiving, and some of them are powerfully worded ...

"And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." Colossians 3:17

"In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." 1 Thessalonians 5:18

Unfortunately, few hymns are devoted exclusively to thanking God. We do have "Now Thank We All Our God" among the small, rich handful. It was written by Martin Rinkart (1586-1649), a Lutheran pastor in the little village of Eilenberg, Saxony. He grew up the son of a poor coppersmith, felt called to the ministry, and after his theological training began his pastoral work just as the Thirty Years' War was raging through Germany.

Floods of refugees streamed into the walled city of Eilenberg. It was the most desperate of times. The Swedish army encompassed the city gates, and inside the walls there was nothing but plague, famine and fear. Eight hundred homes were destroyed and people were dying in increasing numbers. There was a tremendous strain on the pastors, who expended all their strength in preaching the gospel, caring for the sick and dying, and burying the dead. One after another, the pastors themselves took ill and perished until at last only Martin Rinkart was left. Some days he conducted as many as fifty funerals.

Finally, the Swedes demanded a huge ransom. It was Martin Rinkart who left the safety of the city walls to negotiate with the enemy, and he did it with such courage and faith that there was soon a conclusion of hostilities, and the period of suffering ended.

Rinkart, knowing there is no healing without thanksgiving, composed this hymn for the survivors of Eilenberg. It has been sung around the world ever since.

Transfer the Blessings

Using your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for Charitable Donations

If you are over the age of 70 ½, the government generally requires that you must take annual distributions (withdrawals) from your traditional IRAs (Roth IRAs are excluded) and employer-sponsored retirement plans. The money you're required to withdraw gets added to your taxable income. Failure to take your RMD by year-end could result in a stiff IRS penalty. It is a provision known as the required minimum distribution (RMD).

Beginning at age 70 ½, you can have all or part of your distribution made directly from your IRA to a qualified charity. The "qualified charitable distributions" legislative package was made permanent in 2015. Qualified contribution distributions aren't subject to ordinary federal income taxes. Be aware that you can't also claim the qualified distribution as a charitable tax deduction – the amount is simply excluded from your taxable income.


