Pastor's Pen

Psalm 32:1-2 ***Blessed is he whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the man whose sin the LORD does not count against him and in whose spirit it is no deceit.***

I remember the Commodore 64 computer. My parents remember the ancient typewriter. Our children, however, know no such things. They have moved beyond these antiquities as screens are part and parcel of life today. With the age of technology has also come some unexpected spiritual developments. One striking and simple one happens frequently on the blank white word processing screen. Page after white page can be filled so quickly with black type and colored pictures, and with another push of a button, everything but white can be removed! It can happen so fast.

King David's words in Psalm 32 aren't so rushed, but they are beautifully reassuring. The opening line describes those whose "sins do not count" against them in the sight of God Almighty. That is an amazing grace that God would hold not onto the sins of the forgiven. In confession and faith, I get to be counted among them! That is amazing grace! But what, you may ask, has this to do with computers?

Well, we once were given a blank slate – a perfect page upon which to write the history of life. God created Adam and Eve. This page of perfec-

tion didn't last long; that we know, as white pages became darkened, marked with sin. We are also well aware that we soil our own life pages. And clean them up as we try, the smudges and smears and stains of our sin leave these once pristine pages full of the records of misdeeds and moral failures, full of dark marks. If these were all recorded, the screens of our sins would scroll endlessly, and we would be tortured to relive them.

David feels this pain saying in verses 3 & 4: ***When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through all my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer.*** David recognized his condition. He had kept silent. His sin was secret. And in that attempted cover up, his body and soul was wracked with torment. God's hand seemed to crush him, seeping any strength he might have left. It had become a plague; of body, conscience, and spirit.

Finally, David was forced to confront his moral failure. ***Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, I will confess my transgressions to the LORD...*** In his last gasps, in deepest weakness, in dire straits, David finally (Cont. on pg 2)

(cont'd from pg 1) does what God required, he admitted his sin to his LORD.

And you forgave me the guilt of my sin. God, in absolute grace, in powerful mercy, forgave David's sin and removed the guilt that plagued him. It was no accidental strike of the delete key; this was God's ultimate Wisdom: Jesus Christ. God purposely forgave David's sin, your sin, my sin. He did not "okay" it, He did not "ignore" it, He did not "make light of" it. He forgave it. He deleted the guilt. He chose to remember it no more; no longer holding these things against David, or you, or me. He gave our lives blank pages by the blood of His Son poured on them. New sheets to write the praises of God and the practice of obedience. He gave us freedom.

The blank screen on a word processor can be filled with darkened letters quite quickly. In writing this article, it took me no time at all to cover mine in dark digital ink! Just as quickly, I can cover my life with all sorts of dark marks and sinful smudges. Forgiven sinners struggle still with the dirt of sin, death and the devil. We fear the potential failures of others, even potential repeated failure, as much as we do our own. And the strikes stain us even more.

God's forgiveness is new every day. Through repentance and forgiveness, He deletes the mess we create. David's model reminds us to confess even the darkest of sins. David's model reminds us that we do not excuse sin, sweep it under the rug, or live tarnished and weakened by it, rather that we admit it, and find our hope in the LORD; for He will cover them, and remember them "no more."

The saints in heaven live eternally under this covering, draped permanently with the white robes of righteousness we are given. In November we remember these important witnesses of faith and the gifts God gives to us. We give thanks for the countless blessings we are given temporally and eternally by the God who chooses to forgive His penitent people through the sacrifice of His Son and the striking of the delete key upon our sin-filled life-pages. We

celebrate Our Lord's presence in the Festival of Nativities; reminded that Jesus took the blank ink of our sin upon Himself that we might become white as snow. This month, is one where we look to understand and receive the forgiveness of God, and to bestow it, in all its beauty and fullness, to those we have held back from forgiving. This month, we thank God that He treats us with amazing grace, and that through Him alone, we receive it. Thanks be to God.

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE

This year the Endowment Committee recommended the first grant to allow individuals from Trinity to attend Best Practices Ministry in Phoenix, Arizona in February, 2019. The recommendation was approved at a Voter's Meeting this fall.

A list of the individuals that have been nominated for the various positions will be posted in the bulletin on November 25th, December 2nd and December 9th. The nominations will remain open until the December 16th Voter's Meeting. It will be possible to present other nominations from the floor at that meeting,

however, the person nominated must be available to acknowledge that they are willing to accept the nomination before their name can be added to the slate. Once it is apparent that there are no more nominations to present, the nominations will be announced to be closed by the Chair of the Nominating Committee.

Elections will be held by ballot once the nominations are closed. An individual must receive at least 51% of the votes cast to be elected. The elections will be ordered by position as follows: Treasurer, Secretary, Vice President and finally President.

“Let All the Peoples Praise You!”

Psalm 67

May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us, that your way may be known on earth, your saving power among all nations.

Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you!

Let the nations be glad and sing for joy, for you judge the peoples with equity and guide the nations upon earth.

Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you!

The earth has yielded its increase; God, our God, shall bless us.

God shall bless us; let all the ends of the earth fear him!

As our liturgical church year draws to a close, our scriptural readings contain warnings to be watchful and ready. The central portion of Ps. 67 states, “for You judge the peoples with equity”. God judges us to be justified (not guilty), not because of our merit but because of what He has done for us by grace. This Psalm is bookended with blessings. ‘May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us’ and ‘God, our God, shall bless us.’

Our Thanksgiving services will use this Psalm. How fitting a way to remind us of the manifold blessing our Lord has bestowed on us and the enthusiastic invitation to “Praise You, O God”.

The first Sunday in November gives us opportunity to reflect on the saints that have gone on before us and the joys of heaven. We will sing one of my favorite hymns, “For All the Saints.” It is a wide and sweeping vision of the Church Militant and the Church Triumphant. The imagery is regal and joyful, it’s poetry majestic and masterful. A vivid picture is painted in the mind as the wondrous words move by. Verse 8 is another way to say: Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you!
