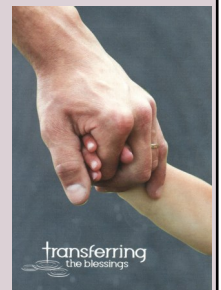

From the Pastor's Desk:

From the Pastor

Realizing that this will be my last official letter to you as your pastor, it's easy to become a bit nostalgic. Although, as I indicated in my last letter, Nancy and I have no intention at this time of moving away, my 22 year relationship with you as Trinity's pastor will end this month. And that does require some "letting go" and "moving on".

A recent experience with my six siblings has helped me put this into perspective. With the death of my mother taking place this spring, we gathered last week to settle the final disposition of my parents' possessions. There wasn't much left. Dad died nine years ago and Mom was in assisted living and memory loss facilities ever since. A lifetime of accumulated things was reduced to a few square feet of table top space.

My brother, Robert, is a DCO at St. Martin's Lutheran Church in Winona. He writes a daily meditation and prayer email for his congregation. In his August 8th meditation which he titled "Letting Go", he shares his thoughts about that day. What he writes resonates with me and the feelings I now have about "letting go". In his words:

Seeing their final items before us, I couldn't help but wonder about our possessions when our time comes to leave this earth. Yes, some of these items will find a new home, some will be recycled, and other things will get thrown away. Though nostalgia ran through my veins, though there was a struggle in some cases to say this or that would be a great memory to have, at the end of the day only a few items came back with each of us. When all is said and done, possessions are things that come to an end.

For human beings, 'Letting Go' isn't easy, whether it's loved ones or possessions, for 'hanging on' brings a comfort of what 'once was' in the hopes of continuance, but eternity is what 'is now and will be forever' . . . Jesus came to win us back to Himself on the cross so that His Everlasting Life and our eternal home will remain with us forever . . . 'Letting Go' here, though hard, opens our minds and hearts fully to what will be -- what will last. For that, we can be thankful."

I am thankful for the opportunity God has given me to walk with you for a time and serve you. I have memories here -- many of which have already created feelings of nostalgia -- that I will take with me until the Lord calls me home. And then I will lay them aside, along with my possessions, in the certain hope of the eternity that is already ours now and will be forever.

For that, I am truly thankful!

I invite you to come to the next new member class!

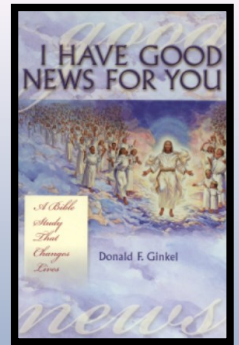
Some of the questions discussed in this course are:

Learning Knows No Bounds

Christ Care group: Creative Crafts with a Mission will be having a fundraising event on September 17th to raise funds for their ongoing project Gabriel's Box. Gabriel's Box was a project that was started by a St. Paul couple in 2003. During a routine ultrasound before his birth it was discovered that the baby had a profound heart defect that could not be fixed. The parents were told they would only have a few short hours with their baby boy before his passing.

Their experience inspired a book "Waiting with Gabriel" and the project known as Gabriel's Box. Amy Kuebelbeck and Mark Nuezil started this project in remembrance of their child Gabriel to help parents with similar losses, most of which would be much more sudden and unprepared than theirs had been. They took 30 boxes to their local hospital to be given to parents in their time of loss. Each box contained specific items to help them address their grief issues.

Boxes include items like a book entitled "When your Baby dies through Miscarriage or Stillbirth." Other items include a scissors and pouch for cutting a lock of hair, wrist bands for both parents, sympathy card, small lamb, small photo frame that says "forever in our hearts", inspirational bookmark and a disposable camera. The cover is lined with the words to Michael W. Smith's "Hello, Good Bye" song on his CD "Live the Life."

In October of 2003 Gabriel's Box came to Trinity as a project taken on by the Christ Care group, the Pairables. When this group disbanded it was passed on to another group Creative Crafts with a Mission. The boxes have seen changes over time. The cameras are no longer used as most everyone has a smart phone or an 'I' phone. A volunteer, Sharon Rowan, has added a small crocheted blanket, and Lucie Schwartzkopf also volunteers in sewing pouches for the project, doing their part for the project. Creative Crafts purchases all the boxes and items needed to go into them from donations. Donations that come from the members of Trinity, Thrivent for Lutherans, and the very families themselves that have experienced loss. Our group assembles them during our group meetings and our liaison, Amber Welsh, delivers them to the hospital as they are needed.

We have received many cards and notes from parents and grandparents in sincere appreciation of this amazing gift. Staff from the hospital also have expressed their deep appreciation for this comforting tool in the face of their challenging work with these parents and their loss. Notes filled with appreciation like the one from Russ and Melissa: "Our son Isaiah Jonathan was stillborn on Nov. 9th, 2013. The materials and mementos you provided for that situation helped preserve precious memories and also aid us in our grief process. Thank you so much for showing the love and comfort of Christ in such a tangible way. Please know that what you do is such a huge blessings to families like ours. God bless you!"

On Sunday September 17th we will be taking an offering after each service for this project to cover the expenses of the items needed for the boxes. We will also have some small craft items for sale between services with proceeds also going toward the materials needed. Each assembled box costs about \$25.00 and we generally provide about 30 to 35 boxes each year. It is our hope that you will prayerfully consider helping us in the rewarding ministry. Thank you for your time and consideration.

Pastoral Call - Committee Update

Dear Members of Trinity,

It is Fall, and there is a crispness in the air. There are some that look at Fall as a new beginning, and a time for anticipation to come. The Pastoral Call-Committee has been in that frame of mind, and has been prayerfully considering "what is to come" at Trinity, as we have spent the past 5 1/2 months studying, surveying, deliberating, and collaborating, as to what the needs of Trinity are, and what the mission and vision will look like in the years to come, namely, as we select a new Shepherd to lead the flock at Trinity. As you re-call, at the July 30, 2017 Voter's Assembly Meeting, a unanimous vote was cast to call Pastor David Hinz, from Zion Lutheran Church in Alexandria, Minnesota to be this Shepherd. Pastor Hinz has been the Senior Pastor at Zion Lutheran Church since 2012. He was the Associate Pastor at Zion from 2006-2012, and was a previous DCE in Mora, Minnesota from 1995-2002.

President Fondow, from the Minnesota North District has described Pastor Hinz in this manner: "Pastor Hinz is outgoing, and relates well to people. He is an effective communicator. His compassion and sensitivity to people's needs is very evident. He is observed to have good pastoral and personal skills in patience, administration, creativity, and community involvement, children's ministry, youth ministry, young adult ministry, singles ministry, ministry to inactives, small group ministry and counseling. He is also observed to have very good personal and pastoral skills in tact, cooperation, initiative, leadership, innovation, older adult ministry, family ministry, personal witnessing, preaching content and delivery, teaching ability and stewardship."

We, on the Call-Committee, ask that you call upon the Holy Spirit to guide Pastor Hinz as he prays, reflects, and meditates on this call. We also ask that you pray for his wife Jennifer, and their three children, Benaiah, Asher, and Lydia. Please continue to pray for Trinity and Zion Lutheran Church in Alexandria, that the transition we are all about to experience, helps us "GROW" in His Word, and "GATHER" in His name.

The Call-Committee, in conjunction with Leadership, Lay Ministry, and the Finance Committee, continue to work together on this important task. The change at Trinity will have a significant impact on Trinity's budget, which will be presented to you as a "preview," in October. Finally, attached below, is the response we received from Pastor Hinz.
